Mode of study

Part-time (Structured): Monthly seminars lead by a study supervisor to discuss progress and share learning using the university's virtual learning environment (VLE) or via video conferencing. In addition, each student will have dedicated support from a study supervise to provide support for their writing their dissertation.
